Growing Your Director by Being a Courageous Follower

Have you ever noticed that when a congregation accepts a new minister, it takes months and even years for the leader and the followers to form a cooperative team with similar vision, goals, processes, and satisfactions? How similar to our Sweet Adelines' directors and choruses as they develop a relationship that brings out the best in them as they grow together as musicians.

I just finished reading an article titled, "In Praise of Followers" (by Lawrence V. Suda, CEO Palatine Group, Inc.) As often said, without followers, there can be no leaders. So, what kind of followers should we be? Not sheep, "yes" people, or alienated people. The article describes a courageous follower as having five different dimensions and attitudes:

- 1. The courage to support the leader;
- 2. The courage to assume responsibility for a common purpose;
- 3. The courage to constructively challenge the leader's behaviors;
- 4. The courage to participate in any transformation needed;
- And the courage to take a moral stand when warranted to prevent ethical abuses.

A follower chorus member, then, respects the director both as a musician and member of the community.

 Listen and don't speak from the risers unless invited. YOU are not the director.

- Give the director the space to try things out. Bring a pencil.
- Learn the notes, words, and interpretation both at home and on the risers.
- Know your own best learning style and do that for yourself.
- Follow the protocols for sharing concerns and suggestions; take your ideas to the right committee, team, or elected person. Or—volunteer for leadership.
- Bring positivity to your rehearsal. You will be happier.
- Sign up! Be engaged! Get on board! Have fun!
- Practice forgiveness and kindness when things aren't perfect. We're all human.
- If you find that your director and you as follower no longer can maintain a relationship for growth, leave on good terms. You will find a new garden.

Sweet Adelines choruses are a wonderful place to practice being good followers in order to make beautiful music.

Education is the passion and purpose of Sweet Adelines, helping each other grow as singers and spread the joy of music to others.

When some people think of barbershop music, they imagine striped vests and the era of black-and-white television.

However, with the popularity of a cappella singing, this traditional American art form continues to be popular. With it there is an increasing number of younger members participating in these groups.

Some may wonder, what's the appeal for someone in the prime of their youth to join such a group? As a 14-year-old member of a wonderful chorus of women who sing in the barbershop style, I can tell you that there are many reasons I am so drawn to barbershop singing.

I have had a love for singing since I was a child, and barbershop is a very rewarding and stimulating form of music. I find the amount of precision and training necessary to take a barbershop style song from good to great is truly awe-inspiring. For anyone interested in music, I

would recommend trying this four-part harmony style of singing.

If someone asked me about the appeal of barbershop, I'd say that it truly brings people together. Our chorus, the Fox Valley Chorus in Neenah, is most comparable to a family. I feel that the real draw of the chorus, perhaps even beyond the musical aspect, is the sense of real and true togetherness provided by the group.

Barbershop singing is an art form that deserves appreciation and respect from people of all ages and backgrounds. The music, performance and the groups can bring a smile to people's faces and create an unforgettable experience for the audience. For me, that is the charm of performing and watching others perform music.

Barbershop music can appeal to many different types of people with its universally captivating qualities. I'm so glad I found this wonderful four-part harmony and supportive group of women.
